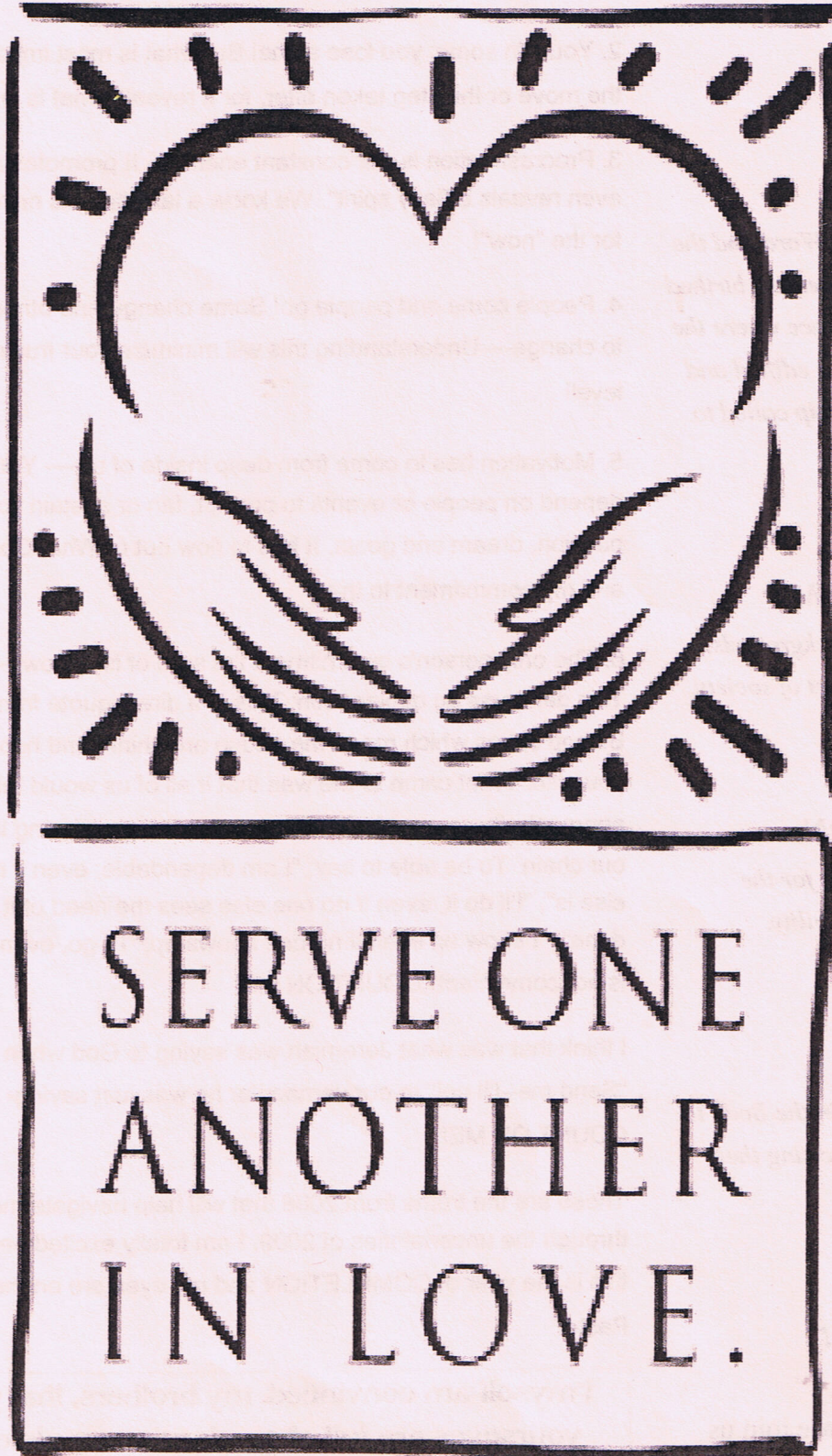

Freedom

Freedom is a great word. We declare it all the time don't we? But as I get older and experience issues both self made and those that come with just living, I realize that freedom is a hard word and something not easily attained.

I'm not questioning God's ability to free us. Certainly through the blood of Jesus that's already accomplished. But accepting and walking in that freedom....well that saints and friends is altogether different. I'll talk from personal experience here.

See if you can relate.

The Revelation:

There is a situation, circumstance, person, relationship etc. from which you need free. At first you have no clue. Whatever the situation, circumstance, addiction, relationship, etc is, you generally like it at first...then you love it...then it becomes a little overwhelming...then it smothers you and begins to threaten to change the essence of who you are as a person...when it gets to this point you don't even know how you got here. How in the world did something fun and fulfilling become life threatening??

If you take an honest look back. There were warning signs. People told you. They warned you. They saw the road you were going down. But you blew them off. For many reasons. One of which is that, you thought they were trying to control you and you weren't going to give them that kind of power. Another reason? Maybe you thought they didn't understand. They didn't know how it made you feel and you don't owe them any explanation...after all, you're grown...(smile) Maybe you thought they were jealous or didn't want to see you happy or fulfilled. Whatever the case may be, you have to acknowledge there were warning signs.

Now the revelation. The light that God shines in on your darkness...your shocked at the revelation that what has been fun, exciting, validating, and fulfilling under God's piercing light has shown up to be, in fact, murderous poison that you've been chugging willingly!

But can you admit it? This is the crazy part. The poison that taste so good is now starting to actually...well...poison you. Your organs are starting to shut down, you're becoming disoriented. You're losing the color in your skin. You're losing your vision and ability to reason. You didn't know what was happening before. But God's light has now shown you. Poison. But you have to say it. You have to admit it.

You have to verbalize it. It must come from your mouth.

This _____ (insert your person, place, or thing) is poison.

God demands you acknowledge it and until you do there will be no freedom. Most of us get stuck at this point and can go no further. Isn't that scary. With all the affects that this poison is having on us, and sadly the people around us, we will not acknowledge that it is poison and eventually, many end up dying from it. Simply because we will not accept God's view on the matter.

Putting the cup down:

Ok. If you've acknowledged the poison. And this is a mighty big IF. Now it's time to put the cup down. Again, it seems so silly doesn't it. If something or someone is slowly killing you and you realize it, common sense says drop it so you can live. But there is a problem: You've grown accustom to the poison, You know it's killing you, but you don't know what to do with out it. In an unbelievable plot twist, when you attempt to put _____ (insert your person, place, or thing) down you feel like you're going to die.

Huh? Let me say it again. When you initially put the poison down, it feels like you're going to die...when in essence it is the poison that is killing you. But you think it's saving and sustaining you. Whoa. So we pick the cup back up and start drinking again. And we feel better... as we slowly begin to die again.

The Scream

If you love Jesus.

If you've acknowledged the poison.

If you've initially put the cup of poison down.

If you've picked the cup back up.

Then you probably have had **the scream**.

It's from your depths. From your soul. From the deepest hurt and pain that you've ever felt. You realize your dying. You realize you can't put the poison down alone. You realize things aren't going to get better if you don't get some help. So you yell out to God.

HELP ME. GET THIS AWAY FROM ME.

I CAN'T DO THIS ON MY OWN.

Any one of those or a combination of them is what I call the Scream!

The significance of Lent

Lent is the fourth season of the Christian year. Its length is the 40 days preceding Easter Day, not counting Sundays. This means Lent always begins on a Wednesday, known as Ash Wednesday.

Lent commemorates Jesus' fast and temptation in the wilderness of Judea Province, which, according to the Gospel, lasted 40 days. Just as Jesus confronted his temptations during these 40 days, Lent helps Christians focus on our most basic need as sinners: forgiveness.

The only way our Lord's forgiving power can become effective in our lives is by our taking the initiative to confront our sins, confess them and repent of them. In short, Lent is a season of penitence.

Some Christians fast during Lent. This denial of bodily comforts can help encourage self-reflection about the need for Jesus' forgiveness.



A day for ashes

Since the Middle Ages, Christians in the so-called

Western Church have observed Ash Wednesday (the 7th Wednesday before Easter) as the first day of Lent. On this day, in many churches, worshipers receive ashes on the forehead as a reminder of their sorrow for their sins. The ashes are often made by burning palm branches left over from the previous year's Palm Sunday. Ash Wednesday is February 25 this year.

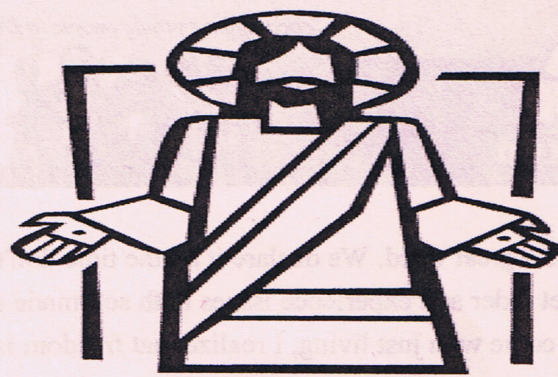
What is Lent?

Valentine's Day

In the early Christian church, there were three priests named Valentine or Valentinus. Though they didn't live at the same time, each was said to be holy and each had been martyred for his faith. All three priests were designated as saints. Around the year A.D. 498, Pope Gelasius declared February 14 as St. Valentine's Day.

Valentine's Day came to be associated with love, romance and marriage. The day is now so popular that only during the Christmas season do people mail more greeting cards.

No matter how many cards, flowers or sweets you receive this Valentine's Day, be assured that God loves you with an "everlasting love" (Jeremiah 31:3, NRSV).

Valentines to give your children

- Acceptance – Teach kids that you love them for who and what they are. Give this gift with a kiss.
- Self-confidence – Help children understand that they can trust themselves. Give this gift with a hug.
- Life without needless fears – Don't let your kids see you as a worrier. Give this gift with laughter.
- Appreciation – Help children acquire a spark of gratitude and enjoy all of life. Give this gift as they go out the door.
- Faith – Introduce our children to God, the best friend they'll ever have. Give this gift by taking them to church every Sunday.



In light of African American History Month, it seemed befitting to spotlight African American's who have changed the world with the Gospel. Read on to learn about just a few world changers...

February 2, 1911 -- During a morning devotional hour at Central Texas College in Waco, a teacher, Eliza George, has a vision of black Africans passing before the judgment seat of Christ. They are weeping and moaning, "No one ever told us You died for us." A few years earlier, while a student at Guadalupe College, Eliza George had responded to an invitation for volunteer missionary service. Now, she felt a vision was prodding her to go to Africa. The college president tried to dissuade her: "Don't let yourself get carried away by that foolishness. You don't have to go over there to be a missionary -- we have enough Africa over here." It would be two more years before Eliza George got up enough courage to leave her teaching position and head to Liberia. In her resignation speech, she read an original poem: "My African brother is calling me; Hark! Hark! I hear his voice . . . Would you say stay when God said go?" On December 12, 1913, Eliza George sailed from New York as a National Baptist missionary.

February 12, 1865 -- Presbyterian minister Henry Garnet becomes the first African American to preach a sermon in the U.S. House of Representatives. Born a slave in Maryland in 1815, Garnet escaped to New England with his father when he was nine years old. In 1852 Garnet went to Jamaica as a Presbyterian missionary. Ill health forced his return to the U.S. in 1855 where he became very active in the abolitionist movement.

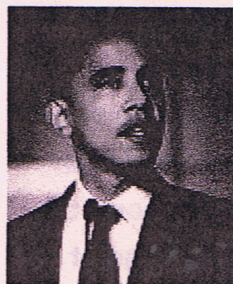
February 13, 1824 -- One hundred and five black emigrants from the U.S. arrive in Liberia on the ship *Cyrus*. They were received by Lott Cary and Colin Teague who had arrived three years earlier to begin an era of missionary expansion by American Negro Baptists. They were the first missionaries sent out by a black group, the Richmond African Baptist Missionary Society.

February 14, 1760 -- Birth of Richard Allen, founder in 1816 of the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) denomination. By 1886, the Church was the world's largest denomination of African Americans.

It had more than four hundred thousand members, nearly three thousand ordained ministers, more than three thousand church buildings, and had sent missionaries to Haiti, San Domingo, and Africa. In 1893 AME headquarters received a request from a group of Afro-Cubans to send missionaries to their island.

February 16, 1922 -- About this date, Jamaican-born Montrose Waite received a letter from the Christian and Missionary Alliance mission board saying they wanted to send him as a missionary to Africa. Waite had won the battle against prejudice and rejection and even friends who urged him to stay in the U.S., his adopted country. Waite would serve as a missionary in Sierra Leone and Liberia and would be instrumental in the founding of the Afro-American Missionary Crusade (1947) and the Carver Foreign Missions organization.

February 20, 2000 -- A heart attack claims the life of Marilyn Lewis, volunteer at the United States Center for World Mission who helped lay the groundwork for their African American Mobilization Division. A school teacher in Pasadena, CA, Marilyn often spoke of her desire to serve as a missionary in Brazil, reaching the descendants of those who had come from Africa. Just prior to her unexpected death, Marilyn had written a call-to-action article: *"Just look at an African-American church today and you can see testimony to our new era: richly decorated, air conditioned sanctuaries with carpeted floors are now quite common. Many drive to church in the latest model cars. Today, instead of working the tables at restaurants, many African Americans own them. God has blessed us. Now it is time for the African American to bless the world in evangelization efforts. In the past many African Americans cried because they could not become involved in missionary work. But now the doors are wide open and we are without excuse."*

'The Love Dare' is a 40-day guided devotional designed to strengthen every marriage. It's featured in the movie *Fireproof*.



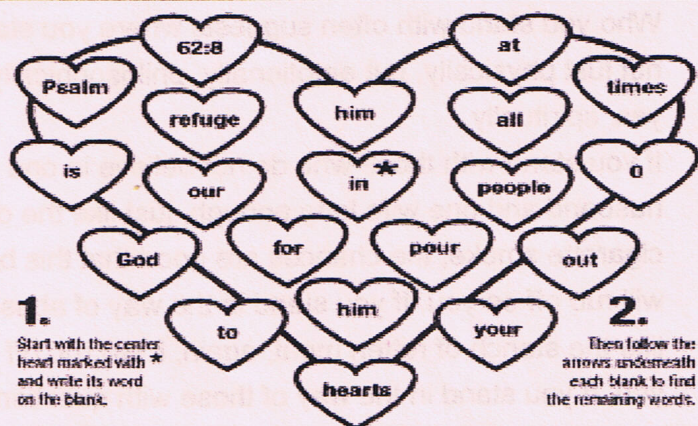

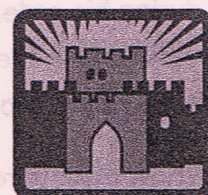

What Tony Snow learned

When Tony Snow was 17, he watched his mother die of colon cancer. In his early 50s, he learned that he, too, had the disease. Sadly, it was too late to do much about it.

As White House press secretary, Snow sometimes shared with members of the press what he was going through. At one gathering, he told what he'd learned during his ordeal. "You have to learn something that is very hard in the modern era," he said, "and that is you have to give yourself to God, to surrender."

Snow discovered that he could find joy even in sickness. Beyond the pain and worries about his family, he sensed God's telling him that he was more blessed than he realized. God was preparing him for his graduation to the Father's house.

When Snow died, he experienced the promise of Scripture: "Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10, NRSV).

Where do you stand? What is your belief system? Have you looked at it, truly examined your beliefs and your actions? If so, are they aligned?

Who you stand with often suggests where you stand, not just physically, but emotionally, philosophically, and yes, spiritually.

If you stand with those who do not believe in one husband and one wife long enough, just like the odor of cigarette smoke, the chances are good that this belief will rub off on you. If you stand in the way of abusers, like the stench of rotten meat, again, it will rub off on you. If you stand in the way of those with questionable morals, like the foul scent from a drunk's blood and bile-filled vomit, it will rub off on you. By the way, how do you smell and where do you stand?

Let's examine ourselves:

1. Take inventory of your beliefs-write down your three main beliefs, and compare them to your behavior- do they match or do you see marked differences?
2. What changes in friends, family, atmosphere are you willing to make in order to "stand" in the right place?
3. Do you have a plan for success- who will help you succeed?

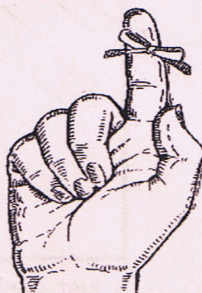

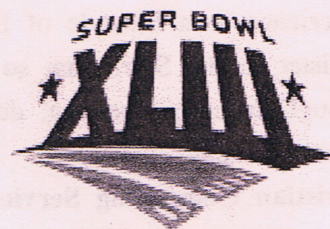
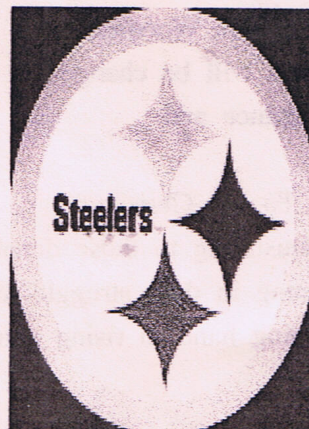
